UPDATE ON SHS FUND RAISING

The focus of the fund raising efforts of St. Paul University Manila is the Senior High School Scholarship Project, support for which has come largely from alumnae. The earliest and most assiduous batch in this endeavor is High School 1962.

In recognition of their pioneering effort, Sr. Evangeline Anastacio, SPC, President, has sent the class the following letter:

Warmest greetings from St. Paul University Manila, Philippines!

We are very happy to inform you that at the beginning of the schoolyear 2016-2017, we accepted about 645 Senior High School (SHS) students in St. Paul University Manila, thirty eight percent (38%) of whom come from the public schools. To supplement government support for these students, we have decided to channel most of the donations to the H.O.P.E. Ablaze Fund to the Senior High School Scholarship Project to cover the gap between the Senior HS voucher and the actual cost of tuition and miscellaneous fees.

We sincerely thank High School Batch'62 for being the very first batch of alumni to pledge support for the Senior High School (SHS) Scholarship Project. Because of your good example, we have started to receive very positive responses from other members of alumni.

Thank you for your donation of Php 312,500.00, which comprises 50% of your pledge for the SHS Scholarship project, and for the additional donation of Php 100,000.00, which covers the book allowance for 25 students. Attached is the list of scholars who were chosen to benefit from your donation for two school years.

We truly appreciate your participation in the mission of the Church through the projects of St. Paul University Manila.

We hope other alumni and friends will support the projects under the H.O.P.E. Ablaze Fund Raising Program of our university as you did.

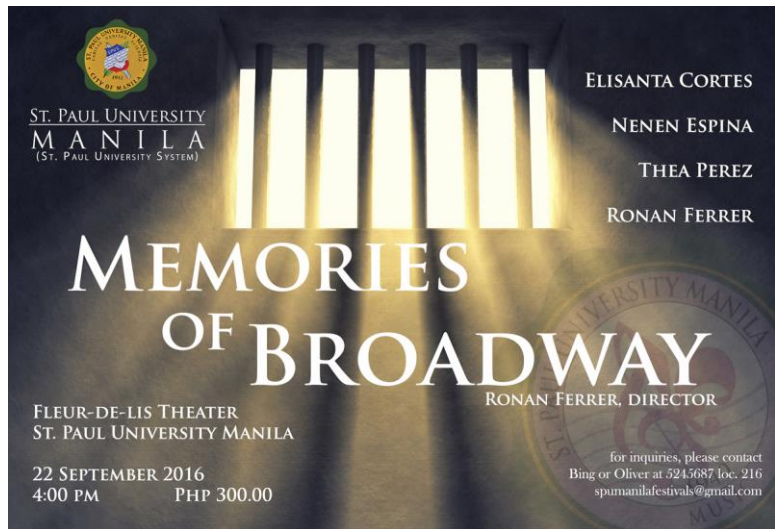
LAST WEEK'S CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

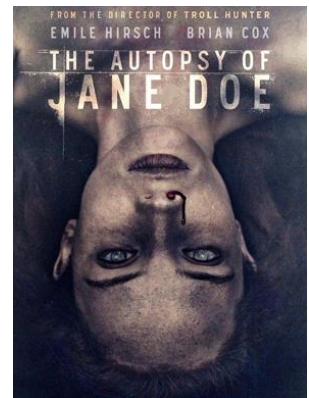
Producer, Ms. Sanchez, and one of the lead actors, John Manalo, graced the special screening.
