The conference was held on 15 March 2018 at JPL Hall of Freedom, Lyceum of the Philippines University. The conference theme was "Cross Cultural Arts Education in Southeast Asia and Pacific, International Concerns in Arts, Culture and Technology in the Region."

They completed the product development research under the guidance of their adviser, Dr. Amelia Butial.
