

## SPU MANILA MUSEUM AND ARCHIVES OPENS SPOON EXHIBIT

The SPU Manila Museum and Archives, *Le Musée Paulinien*, repository of the university's historic and cultural patrimony, is presenting an exhibit of a collection of rare spoons donated by an alumna of St. Paul Vigan.



### Fast Facts:

**The World in Spoonfuls is a Special Exhibition of the** Rachel Joven International Spoon Collection. It consists of more than a thousand spoons from 88 countries in six continents.

The spoons were collected over a period of some 40 years from auctions, antique shops and markets during the travels and visits of the late Ms. Joven—as a personal hobby, and later, a passion.

In the collection are both antique, historical, and commemorative spoons of gold, silver and other art materials.

The spoons are arranged in sets that include those of Antiquity, the Old World, the New World, North and South America, Asia, Australia/Oceania, and special collections.

The exhibition is no less than experience of art and culture, history, and faith as the appreciative viewer may discover in the spoon's minute size and delicate craftsmanship.

In their tiny form, the spoons carry symbols of man's faith, his philosophies and his arts, his lifestyles in the city and the country side.

The bowls, stems, finials and back of spoons were chronicles of man—his evolving philosophies and faith in himself, his world and his God.

As "each spoon has a story to tell," one discovers bits and pieces of the old world as he travels the globe through the Exhibition.

The exhibit opens at 4:00 P.M., Saturday, 26 January 2019 with a short program, followed by the ribbon-cutting and formal opening.

## The collector...



### Rachel Joven – Art Enthusiast, Lay Missioner

Rachel is an alumna of St. Paul School Sta. Lucia and of Rosary College, Vigan. One of the early "pensionados"(scholars) to the US, she took up post graduate studies and soon worked with John Hopkins Hospital as Director for Health Records and then as UN-WHO Consultant for over 20 years, which brought her to 150 countries in the world.

A "lay missioner" with her sister Dr. Lyn Joven, both dreamed to "give back" to their homeland, to share their good fortune and family wealth. Residing in Baltimore, they took turns coming home six months each year to manage the charities they put up in Sta. Lucia, their hometown: a free medical clinic, free library, Children's Rondalla, scholarships, etc. Active in Church ministry, they helped build chapels, shrines, and grottoes and were benefactors to seminarians, priests, and religious both in the Philippines and in the U.S.

As a Paulinian and good Catholic, Rachel was always moved by charity, believing that life has no other purpose but to be shared with others for God's purposes. Her spoons, her books, her music, her life—together tell Rachel Joven's story and are channels today of her continuing charity.

On 10-12 January 2019, Sr. Ma. Evangeline Anastacio, SPC, President, and Sr. Ma. Vicenta Estrella, SPC, Vice-President for Finance attended the inaugural convention of “The Belt and Road Sino-Philippine U20 University Alliance for Industry-University-Research” or U20 in Qingdao, China.

The U20 Sino-Philippine Deep-Sea University Alliance aims to gather top universities in China and the Philippines to boost cooperation and exchange of personnel and promote the common development between the two countries with the broad objective of being part of the construction of an innovative global economy.

Represented in the convention aside from St. Paul University, Manila were University of the Philippines Manila, De La Salle University Taft, Philippine Women’s University, St. Scholastica’s College, Adamson University, Lyceum of the Philippines, Emilio Aguinaldo College, Southeast Asia Interdisciplinary Development Institute, and World Citi Colleges Inc. Natalya Sannikova, PhD, Member of the Russian Union of Composers, was also there to represent the M.I. Glinka Novosibirsk State Conservatory in Russia.
