SPECIAL REPORT: BLESSING OF THE MUSIC THERAPY CENTER

The ST. PAUL UNIVERSITY MANILA MUSIC THERAPY CENTER was formally opened with the Launching of the Music Therapy Program on 10 October 2014. It is the FIRST Music Therapy Center in the Philippines, which will provide music therapy services for differently challenged children, adolescents, and adults. As with all music therapy sessions, the goals of the music therapy offered in the Center depend on the needs, abilities, and challenges of the clients. They can range from increased mobility to improved communication skills, to reduced anxiety or exploring personal issues. Through music therapy's well planned, professional, and skillful use of music, St. Paul University Manila hopes to help improve the quality of life for people with disabilities of various kinds and to help children with developmental disabilities to reach their highest potentials.

With Ms. Lourna Tagay as commentator, the celebration started with a greeting from Sr. Maria Anunciata Sta. Ana, SPU Manila Dean of the College of Music and the Performing Arts. The cutting of the ceremonial ribbon was led by Sr. Lilia Thérèse L. Tolentino, SPC, Provincial Superior of the Sisters of St. Paul of Chartres in the Philippines, assisted by Sr. Maria Evangeline Anastacio, SPC, President of St. Paul University Manila, and Ms. Annette Asuncion, music alumna, resource professor, and music therapist from the USA. The Music Therapy Center was blessed by Fr. Francis Salcedo, a member of the SPU Manila faculty for Religious Education.

Ms. Lalaine V. Mallari, Program Chair for Mass Communication, emceed a short program, which followed, at the 2nd floor ballroom of the HRM Training Center. Sr. Maria Evangeline Anastacio, SPC gave the welcome address, followed by a short introduction about Music Therapy given by Ms. Elizabeth Flordeliza, the first graduate of the Master of Arts in Music, Major in Music Therapy (2014). Ms. Annette Asuncion showed by video clips how music therapy works. A song from the St. Paul University Manila Chorale ushered the special award, **The Plaque of Excellence**, given to Ms. Annette Asuncion, in recognition of her unique and outstanding role in assisting St. Paul University Manila pioneer the Music Therapy Program in the Philippines.
