Guiuan Takes Over SSC Presidency

MANILA – Joanna Marie Guiuan from the College of Nursing and Allied Health Sciences (CNAHS) took over the top position of the Supreme Student Council (SSC), also called the

Paulinian Student Government (PSG) on July 27, 2019, at the culmination of a three-day PSG Leadership Training held in Levesville Hall.

She garnered most of the votes from the different college councils and organizations to secure a close win against Clydel Labor from the College of Business and Management.

Taking the Lead

Even before the election, Guiuan recognized her fellow members of the SSC as equals. In a one-on-one interview with *The Paulinian*, she emphasized that the position actually does not matter to her as much as working with her fellow council members.

“Regardless of the position, we’ll work together to make this [academic year] exciting and fun for everyone,” Guiuan said after learning she was elected to the top post.

She also stated that working with the team prior to the election helped them not only to distinguish what positions they will fit in, but also to solidify the council as a dynamic group. Guiuan also added that the team had earlier talked about the time when they would take positions, but they promised that they would all work together. Hand in hand, they will improve themselves in order to serve their fellow students.

On Collaborative Efforts

As a top priority, the new set of officers already drafted a plan for each college to have an outreach program.

Guiuan pointed out that for the SSC to serve even more, they must have a larger and more efficient team. On or off-campus, every college should use their expertise and maximize their capabilities for a greater purpose. For instance, the College of Nursing could teach proper hygiene in several depressed areas. HRM students could conduct small seminars on proper food handling and related topics.
