Assigned to St. Paul University of Manila for almost a decade (1968-1977), she taught Psychiatric Nursing, among other subjects. Sr Angelica spent her retirement years at Mere Monique Home in Ticud, LaPaz, Iloilo, where the Angelis Christies (SPCM BSN'74) and HS'69 Paulinians provided gratitude and support to their beloved clinical instructors.

SOME GOOD NEWS



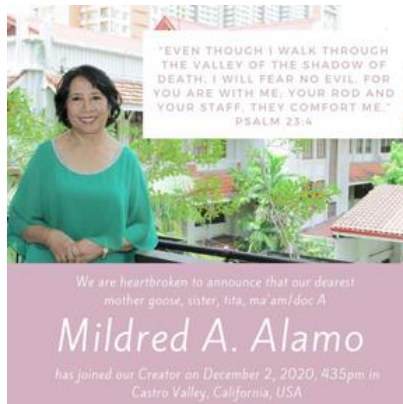
Teresa Ignacio-Gonzalvo, BSN 1974, was inducted President of the Philippine Nurses Association of Virginia.
