The Paulinian Center for Culture and Heritage (PCCH), formerly the University Museum and Archives, launched Paulinian Gems on 22 July 2021, in honor of Mother Marie Madeleine Denoga, SPC, First Filipino Provincial of the Sisters of St. Paul of Chartres. Sr. Flordeliza Deza, SPC, Head, External Relations and Internationalization, described the Paulinian Gems as things precious and rare. The first feature was the PCCH.

The museum was a major project of the Centennial Celebration of St. Paul University Manila in 2012. Envisioned to be the repository of the school's historical and cultural patrimony, the PCCH (as it is now called) showcases the "story" of the school, providing a retrospective look at the past from the school's beginnings to the rebuilding after the war years, its evolution to the present—and the people who lived this story—impelling to a new perspective as the school continues to fulfill its educational mission today and into the future.
