SPU Manila joins 3rd Quarter Online Nationwide Simultaneous Earthquake Drill

The following memo was sent to the SPU Manila community on the earthquake drill:

On September 9, 2021, the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) under the Office of the Civil Defense will be conducting the 3rd Quarter Online Nationwide Simultaneous Earthquake Drill (NSED).

As part of the advocacy of the university, all members of the community are required to participate in this activity to continue instill earthquake preparedness amid the pandemic.

The Online NSED this September 9th will be live via Zoom and Facebook Page of the "Civil Defense PH" https://www.facebook.com/civildefensePH. The program will start at 08:00 AM and the online ceremonial pressing of the button (indicating the alarm for the earthquake) will be at 09:00 AM.

Please find the attached guidelines for Paulinians reporting at work inside the school and Paulinians working and studying at home.

Inside St. Paul University Manila (In Campus) Assumptions

- 1. There will be a one (1) minute of strong shaking.
- 2. During this earthquake, persons cannot stand.
- 3. Buildings may have been damaged but no collapse and there may be possible falling objects, including glass windows.
- 4. During this earthquake, no immediate assistance will be available for at least several hours. With this, self-help and sustenance are required.

Earthquake Drill

- 1. Everyone should remain inside their units/offices or classrooms all throughout the duration of the drill.
- 2. Employees who are inside their units/offices are to ensure that hardhats can easily be retrieved, and the hardhats should be worn during the earthquake (or siren/alarm).
- 3. Employees who are outside their units/offices should not bring their hardhats; in actual disasters, people do not have with them hardhats when they are outside of work areas.
- 4. While the alarm is ongoing, everyone should move away from windows, glass or light fixtures, shelves or cabinets, and other heavy objects.
- 5. Everyone must practice DUCK, COVER, and HOLD.
- 6. Everyone must cover head and nape, especially if not wearing hardhat.
