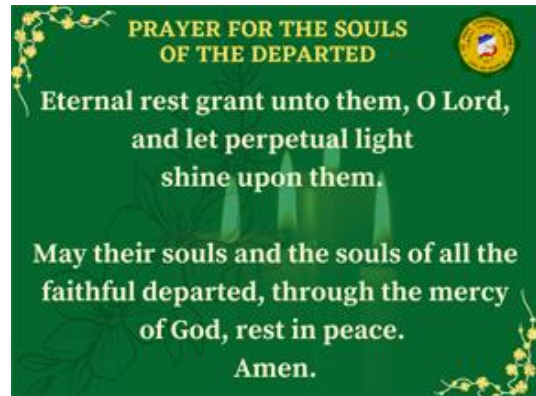
IN THESE PANDEMIC TIMES...

Also featured were Fil-Thai's Got Talent, People's Choice, Part One, China's Marko Song and the CMPA's very own Dr. Jennifer Olivar.

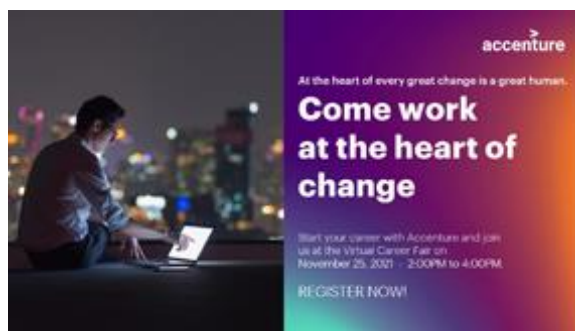
