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Day One of Pre-opening

One of the main activities during Day 1 of the 2025-2026 Pre-opening Activity was a talk entitled Living out the Paulinian Vision Mission. The session, facilitated by Dr. Jennifer Ramos, an alumna (BSC 1993) and a part time faculty in the College of Business and Management, focused on three (3) questions after the 2024 vision and mission of St. Paul of Chartres Education Ministry was presented.

These questions were answered by the entire SPU Manila community with a total of 127 participants (8 SPC Sisters, 26 lay managers, 12 College Faculty, 5 SHS faculty, 4 ANTS, 38 NAP, and 34 Maintenance). Three groups were created, and each participant was asked to answer the questions by posting the answer on a color-coded sticker paper. The team leaders presented the general and similar responses of the team.

The RPQA team decided to analyze the responses more thoroughly as the responses can be used in the next strategic planning period. Questions 1 and 2 were analyzed using descriptive analysis where the responses were grouped together based on similar ideas, while question 3 was analyzed using word count.

The results

Q1: How do I see myself contributing to the school's mission?

- #1. Make a difference through active participation
- #2. Engage in various service activities
- #3. Be all to all to my students and academic community
- #4. Serve with truth and dignity
- #5. Provide efficient service
- #6. Volunteer and help in all activities

Q2: What part of the vision inspires me the most?

- #1. Making a difference
- #2. Empowered Paulinian
- #3. Christ-centered
- #4. For church and society



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Q3: Which core value do I want to live out this year and why?

Core Value: Christ-centeredness

Tally: 17 counts

Reasons given: "Because I want to re-connect, grow and focus on my faith and the love of Christ and to share this love with others"

"To inspire others to love Christ and to faithful to Him"

Core Value: Community

Tally: 10 counts

Reasons given: "To be more connected, being present and to value other people and their voices" "Teamwork makes the dream work and living out the core value of community ensures that no one is invisible, no one is left behind across all the members of the academic community."

Core Value: Charity

Tally: 8 counts

Reasons given: "I want to give my full service to SPUM as this is one of the ways I can give back to my alma mater."

"I want to serve our community with love, service, and compassion; to be more active in the community service activities of the school"

Core Value: Charism

Tally: 6 counts

Reasons given: "I wish to share my talents to my students and colleagues and continuously be a team player in the community."

Core Value: Commission

Tally: 6 counts

Reasons given: "To be committed to my mission in transforming education and to actively help and be of service of the everyone."

Recommendations based on the results of the activity:

1. Include all stakeholders in the various activities of the university since there is a palpable expression of willingness to actively participate, volunteer, and engage.
2. Provide equal opportunities and allow everyone to share their time and talents since most are inspired to make a difference and be empowered.
